

DEFENSIVE DRIVING CLASSES



Drivers 55 and older who complete the course qualify for a ten percent discount on their vehicle insurance premium for three years. Developed by the Minnesota Safety Council and conducted throughout the state, Defensive Driver teaches preventive measures to use when driving that saves lives. Effective July 1, 2024,the Accident Prevention Course Rule states that the course must be a total of at least 4 hours. This means that a first-time participant can take a 4-hour program as their initial training - the 8-hour program will no longer be a requirement. 8-hour classes will not be offered with a live instructor but it is available online. Classes are held at the Sleepy Eye High School. Please call and register so we know if we have enough to hold the class and also so we have your contact information in case class gets canceled.

Cost is \$30 per person.

Minimum class size is 12 and maximum is 25.

Early Childhood Family Education

Since parents are the first and most important teachers for their children, all families are welcome in the ECFE program. No one will be denied participation due to inability to pay. Scholarships are available. Classes are held in the ECFE rooms (#318-320) in the Sleepy Eye Elementary School.

Spring term continues with offerings for all ages of preschoolers. The child's age as of September 1, 2024 should be used to determine which class to enroll. The teachers take into consideration children's developmental levels when planning activities for each class. 1000 Books before Kindergarten - The goal of the program is to promote reading and encourage children to have had 1000 books read to them by the time they enter kindergarten. Enrollment in the program can be done at the Dyckman Free Library or any ECFE classes or events. Once enrolled, children will receive a log to track the books being read to them. If you read a book twice, mark it down twice! After each 100 books read, children will receive a small prize or sticker. Special incentives are awarded to children when they complete 300, 500, 700 or 1000 books.

Preschool Offerings



School District #84 offers a three-year-old **Discovery Time** preschool three days a week for two hours and 15 minutes. Parents also attend ECFE classes with the child. Scholarships are available for qualifying families and busing is available in town. Early sign-up is encouraged as classes fill fast! Registration information will be available in July.

Voluntary Pre K is available for four year olds and meets 140 days for two and a half hours during the school year. A grant application will be submitted to the Minnesota Department of Education to obtain financial support for the program participants.

Other preschools are available at Grace Lutheran Church, St. Mary's Catholic School and Tri Valley Head Start.
